More vote fraud charges filed

he Lake County Vote Fraud Task Force has filed 39 felony charges against 11 people it claims is linked to voter fraud in the 2003 Lake County primary election.

Among them are three East Chicago police officers.

The task force has now filed charges against 45 people since it began its work two years ago.

According to a news release from the Indiana Attorney General, those charged are:

Jose Arroyo, 38, of Hammond, charged with seven D felonies: four counts of voting in a precinct other than which he lived, applying for or receiving a ballot in a precinct other than that which he was entitled to vote, and two counts of perjury.

Edwin Aviles, 39, of Portage, an East Chicago city employee, charged with one D felony: voting in a precinct other than which he lived.

Rachel Aviles, 36, of Portage, charged with one D felony: voting in a precinct other than which she lived.

Raymond Carillo, 55, of Hammond, an East Chicago city employee, charged with one D felony: voting in a precinct other than which he lived.

John Carlyle, 56, of Gary, an East Chicago city employee, charged with seven D felonies: applying for or receiving a ballot in a precinct other than that which he was entitled to vote, four counts of voting in a precinct other than which he lived, and two counts of perjury.

Michelle Chandler, 39, of Merrillville, an East Chicago city employee, charged with five D felonies: fraudulent receipt of a ballot, two counts of voting in a precinct other than which she lived, and two counts of perjury.

Lester Chandler Jr., 37, of Merrillville, an East Chicago police officer, charged with two D felonies: two counts of voting in a precinct other than which he lived.

Ronald de Castro, 36, of Schererville, an East Chicago police officer, charged with four D felonies: applying for a ballot or receiving a ballot in a precinct other than he lived, voting in a precinct other than which he lived, and two counts of perjury.

Mario Del Valle, 31, of Hammond, an East Chicago city employee, charged with six D felonies: applying for or receiving a ballot in a precinct other than which he lived, three counts voting in a precinct other than which he lived, and two counts perjury.

Randy Morris, 43, of Merrillville, an East Chicago police officer, charged with one D felony: voting in a precinct other than which he lived.

Mark Orosco, 28, of Hammond, charged with four D felonies: applying for or receiving a ballot in a precinct other than that in which he lived, voting in a precinct other than which he lived, and two counts perjury.

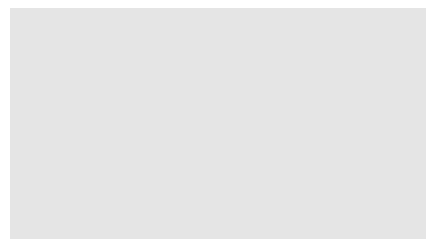

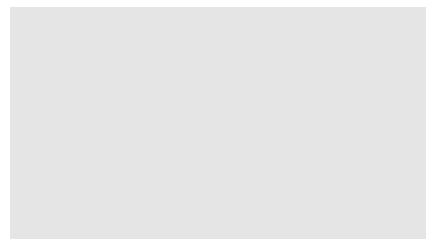

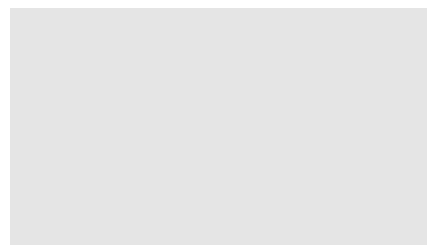

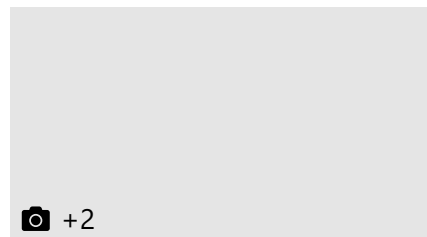

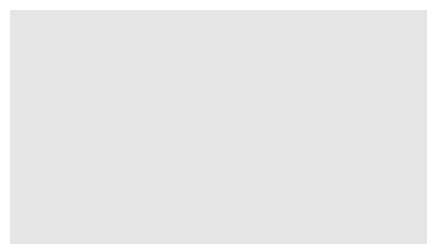
