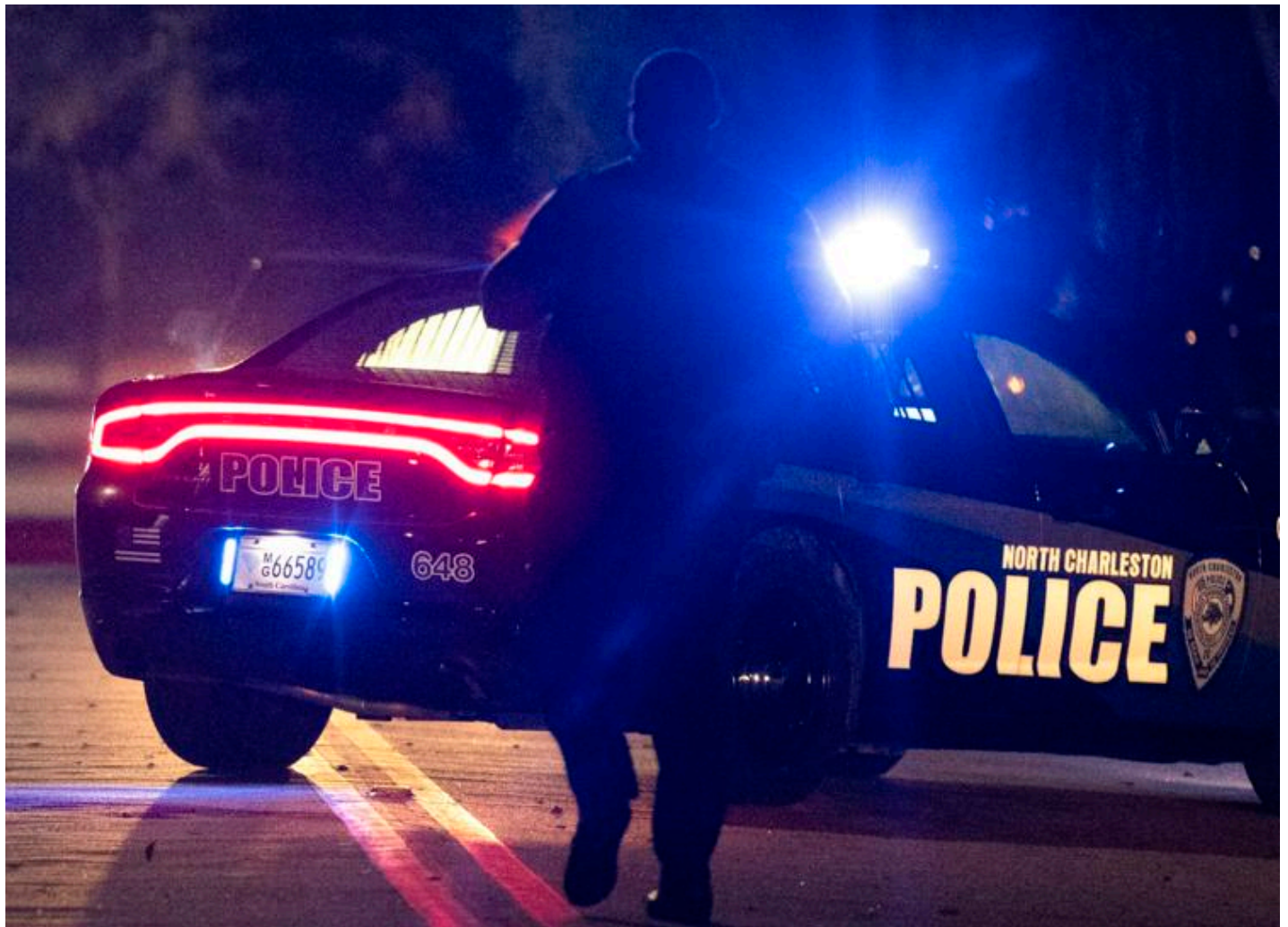

## North Charleston man drags woman through front yard; witness grabs his handgun

**NORTH CHARLESTON** — When a Lakes subdivision neighbor saw a man dragging a woman by her hair through the front yard of a nearby home, he went inside and grabbed his handgun, according to a police report.

He'd seen the man dragging her along the fence line, through the grass and toward the front door of a nearby home on Jan. 4. He stopped and asked the woman if she was OK and she responded no, the witness later told police.

The witness called 911 and returned to the scene armed for his and the victim's protection, he later told officers. When North Charleston police arrived on the scene, an officer drew a duty weapon and ordered both men to surrender, the incident report states. The witness dropped his handgun and told officers he'd called 911.

Officers arrested Jackson Edwin Pappin, 33, of North Charleston on the scene and charged him with **domestic violence in the first degree**. While handcuffed, Pappin yelled at officers, protesting the arrest and demanding to be released, according to the incident report.

The police officers noted Pappin was visibly intoxicated, slurred his words and smelled of alcohol. There was no explicit mention in the redacted incident report of a blood-alcohol test being administered.

This is Jackson Pappin's first criminal offense in the tri-county area, according to an online records search by The Post and Courier.

On Jan. 5, a magistrate judge set a \$250,000 cash bond for Pappin's release with the conditions that he have no contact with the victim or those in her circle, **according to inmate records**.

As of 11:30 a.m. Jan. 6, Pappin is listed as a current inmate of the Al Cannon Detention Center, not yet posting bond.
